

South Berwick Town Council October 11, 2011

The Manager reported the following to the Clerk:

Vice Chairman Gerald W. MacPherson, Sr. called the meeting to order at 5:35pm. Councilors present included, Jean Demetracopoulos, David H. Webster, and John C. Kareckas. Town Manager Perry Ellsworth was also in attendance. Chairman David Burke arrived at the beginning of the regular session at 6:30pm.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

1. On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Kareckas, it was unanimously voted to enter executive session at 5:30pm pursuant to 1MRSA §405.6E to consult with the Town's Attorney.

On a motion by Mr. Kareckas, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to end the executive session at 5:51pm.

On a motion by Mr. Kareckas, seconded by Mr. Webster, it was unanimously voted to recess the meeting at 5:52pm.

The meeting was reconvened by Chairman Burke at 6:30pm with the Clerk present.

Approval of Minutes

1. Public Hearing 9-27-11: On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Webster, it was unanimously voted to adopt the minutes as written.

2. Council 9-27-11: On a motion by Mr. Webster, seconded by Mr. Kareckas, it was unanimously voted to adopt the minutes after amending the 2nd to last sentence in Public Comment to read regarding architectural design phase 3; "there is no phase 3 in the offing at the moment" (*underlined language added*).

3. Special Council 10-4-11: On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. MacPherson, it was unanimously voted to adopt the minutes as written.

Treasurer's Warrant – Oct 11, 2011

On a motion by Mr. MacPherson, seconded by Mr. Kareckas, it was unanimously voted to sign the warrant in the amount of \$1,578,709.84.

Public Comment

1. Ruth Boston, Emery's Bridge Rd, asked for the status of the Balancing Rock. Mr. Burke stated that there has been no resolution as of yet.

Reports & Correspondence

1. See 1st item of Manager's Report

Town Manager's Report

-The Manager announced that South Berwick has received an \$8,779 dividend check from the Maine Municipal Association as a result of our good loss experience and loss prevention programs.

-Reminded everyone of the construction update meeting at the library on Thursday at 7:00pm.

-Made note of the Young Street closing on Thursday and Friday, October 13th and 14th to accommodate water and electrical work for the library.

-Suggested holding a workshop to discuss the Avesta Housing proposal.

-Commented that the library project is moving along. 110 power will be installed instead of 3 phase.

-Attended the Maine Municipal Association annual convention. He commented that many communities are dealing with similar funding issues.

-PWD projects are wrapping up for the season.

Unfinished Business

1. On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. MacPherson, it was unanimously voted to adopt the amendments to the Zoning Ordinance sections 140-12 District Boundaries and 140-77 Site Plan Review as presented at the September 27, 2011 public hearing.

On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Kareckas, it was unanimously voted to adopt the amendments to the Subdivision Ordinance sections 121-27 Procedures, 121-28 Submissions, 121-31 Preliminary Plan Submissions, and 121-36 Final Plan Submissions as presented at the September 27, 2011 public hearing.

New Business

1. The Council discussed the conflict between the regular meeting date of November 8th and Election Day. On a motion by Mr. Webster, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to reschedule the meeting of November 8th to November 15th.

2. On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. MacPherson, it was unanimously voted to sign the warrant calling the Municipal Election for Tuesday, November 8, 2011.

3. On a motion by Mr. MacPherson, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to accept the Maine Library Equipment Grant. (\$3,381.53 for 2 laptops and 1 desktop computer) Mr. Burke confirmed that there is no match.

4. On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Kareckas, it was unanimously voted to hold a public hearing on Tuesday, November 25th at 6:30pm to receive comment on the updated General Assistance Ordinance Appendices.

5. The Council discussed whether it wanted to pursue a Fireworks Ordinance.

Mr. Ellsworth stated that several surrounding towns are also looking at an ordinance. He recommended holding a workshop.

Councilors expressed mixed feelings in regard to instituting an ordinance. Consensus was that there is no rush and agreed to table action till such time that the manager is able to obtain additional information.

6. On a motion by Mr. Webster, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to authorize the purchase of one Dodge 5500 Chassis with a Cummins engine including winter setup and trade in allowance ('91 L8000 & '03 F550) from H. P. Fairfield in the amount of \$87,500.00, with the funds to be taken from the CIP Highway Equipment Account.

Council Member Comments

1. Mrs. Demetracopoulos:

-Made note of the request received for 25mph signs on Millstream Lane. She added that there have been additional requests for speed limit signs and suggested that the issue be placed on an upcoming agenda.

-Stated that it is pleasurable to look through the financials this year; the budget is being kept in line.

2. Mr. Kareckas:

-Asked why the first article on the election warrant is to elect a moderator. The Clerk explained that municipal elections by secret ballot are town meetings and a moderator is required to preside.

3. Mr. Webster:

-Commented that the Route 4 bridge work seems to be nearing completion.

4. Mr. Burke:

-Asked that the Manager keep the Chair and Council informed in regard to any construction budget shortfalls for the library project.

-Stated that the moisture problem in the basement at the new library will be monitored.

-Stated that the School Board had passed a motion to fund crossing guards contingent on the presence of a traffic control officer. He asked the other Councilors to give thought to the issue so it can be discussed at the next meeting.

-Stated that he did not receive any negative comments from the Council in regard to Mr. Ellsworth's performance evaluation. He stated that the evaluation was outstanding and will be submitted to the personnel file.

Adjournment

On a motion by Mr. Kareckas, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to adjourn the meeting at 7:26pm.
