

South Berwick Town Council September 24, 2013

Chairman Gerald W. MacPherson, Sr. called the meeting to order at 6:30pm. Councilors present included Jean Demetracopoulos, David H. Webster, John C. Kareckas, and Russell H. Abell. Town Manager Perry Ellsworth was also in attendance.

Approval of Minutes

1. Council 9-10-13: On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Webster, it was unanimously voted to adopt the minutes as written.

Treasurer's Warrant – Sept 24, 2013

On a motion by Mr. Abell, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to sign the warrant in the amount of \$235,876.37.

Public Comment

None

Town Manager's Report

- Reminded everyone of the Incident Command Training on October 9th.
- Trying to schedule a workshop date with the Building Committee; the first available date is October 23rd.
- Resurfacing work begins on the Brattle Street Bridge on Monday, September 30th. The State DOT plans on closing the bridge for 2 weeks.
- Announced that Roberta Orsini's last day with the Town is Friday, September 27th. He thanked her for all she has done for the community. "She leaves a big hole."

Unfinished Business

1. On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Webster, it was unanimously voted to authorize the Town Manager to sign the Purchase and Sale Agreement selling 3 lots (Tax Map 2, Lots 37, 39, and 39A, off York Woods Rd) to the Great Works Regional Land Trust.
 2. **The Council briefly discussed Eliot's Clean Air Act Petition.**
 - Mrs. Demetracopoulos commented that the models should reflect live data and they do not.
 - Mr. MacPherson commented that it is puzzling why we would want to weigh in since the Schiller Station is in compliance.
 - Mr. Kareckas read an email response to his inquiry concerning Pierce Island. Lisa Landry of the NH Dept. of Environmental Services responded "In response to your question: *"How often during the year is Pierce Island down-gradient, wind wise, from the Schiller Station?"* we have evaluated the meteorological data recorded at Pierce Island air monitoring station for a 5-year period (2008-2012). *Winds at that site are variable and originate from all directions.*"
"We started with a straight line from the Schiller Station to the Pierce Island monitoring station. We then expanded out 10-15 degrees to each side of the line to estimate plume movement. The data indicates that wind blows from the Schiller Station toward the Pierce Island monitor approximately 8-15% of the time."
-Mr. Abell stated that with the lack of convincing data, he is uncomfortable supporting either side.
- On a motion by Mr. Webster, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to table action at this time **on Eliot's Clean Air Act Petition.**

New Business

1. On a motion by Mr. Kareckas, seconded by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, it was unanimously voted to accept Rick Coughlin's resignation from the Historic District Commission.

2. **Emery's Junkyard Permit:** The Code Enforcement Officer has reported that they are in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance.

On a motion by Mrs. Demetracopoulos, seconded by Mr. Webster, it was unanimously voted to grant the Permit through September 30, 2014.

3. **Lynch's Junkyard Permit:** The Code Enforcement Officer has reported that they are in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance.

On a motion by Mr. Webster, seconded by Mr. Kareckas, it was unanimously voted to grant the Permit through September 30, 2014.

Council Member Comments

1. Mrs. Demetracopoulos:

-Asked if the information provided to Council about Comcast's program to provide free internet access for families eligible for subsidized school lunches had been provided to the school district.
-Extended her best wishes to Roberta Orsini for a job well done in the past, and a job being well done going forward.

2. Mr. Webster:

-Commented that he was glad the road construction was coming to an end. His crosswalk concerns are being addressed.
-Thanked Jon St. Pierre for keeping all parties informed of upcoming and ongoing projects.

3. Mr. Kareckas:

-Made note of the change in name from Southern Maine Regional Planning Commission (SMRPC) to Southern Maine Planning and Development Commission (SMPDC).

4. Mr. Abell:

-Made note of the Annual Harvest Raiser on October 6th at the Old Fields Farm. The event raises funds to help support members of the community coping with serious health concerns.
-Thanked Roberta Orsini for her service and wished her the best of luck.

5. Mr. MacPherson:

-Commented on the Brattle Street Bridge Closure. The biggest disruption will be for the school buses.
-Expressed his best wishes to Roberta Orsini in her new position.
-Commented that the Memorial Bridge is up and closed.

Adjournment

On a motion by Mr. Kareckas, seconded by Mr. Webster, it was unanimously voted to adjourn the meeting at 7:00pm.

Chapter 84

Add language in red and delete language with strikethroughs:

84-11(9) Demolition approval criteria. ~~To preserve and or document historic landmarks and places of historical significance. All demolition and or removal of buildings shall be sent to the HDC for review according to the Secretary of the Interior Standards for Historic Buildings.~~ The criteria for approving proposals to demolish ~~or remove~~ any building, historic site or land mark within the ~~historic district or to demolish or remove any building within the B1, B2, or BR zoning district~~ **Town of South Berwick** are that a sixty-day public notice period be declared by the Historic District Commission immediately after receiving a demolition proposal from any property owner, at any regular or specially scheduled meeting of the Commission. At the end of this sixty-day period, demolition criteria shall be deemed met, and the Commission shall then issue a certificate appropriateness to demolish the building(s) or landmark(s) or to relocate the building(s) or landmark(s) if a willing buyer who is able to finance the costs of purchase and removal has been found. In addition to providing an opportunity for buildings or landmarks to be relocated rather than demolished, the sixty-day period also allows time for the Commission to make a photographic survey of the building(s) interior and exterior or landmark(s) and to examine alternative ways to meet the owner's needs (such as by replacing interior walls and floors or demolishing everything except the street-front facade). The owner or applicant for a demolition proposal shall be required to meet with the Commission to discuss any such alterations.

§ 653. Hearings; bureau review; appeal

- 1. Hearing. The municipal officers or, in the case of unincorporated places, the county commissioners of the county in which the unincorporated place is located, shall hold a public hearing for the consideration of applications for new on-premise licenses and applications for transfer of location of existing on-premise licenses.
A. The bureau shall prepare and supply application forms. [1993, c.730, §27(amd).]
B. The municipal officers or the county commissioners, as the case may be, shall provide public notice of any hearing held under this section by causing a notice, at the applicant's prepaid expense, stating the name and place of hearing, to appear on at least 3 consecutive days before the date of hearing in a daily newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where the premises are located or one week before the date of the hearing in a weekly newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where the premises are located. [1995, c.140, §4 (amd).]
C. If the municipal officers or the county commissioners, as the case may be, fail to take final action on an application for a new on-premise license, for transfer of the location of an existing on-premise license or for renewal of an on-premise license within 60 days of the filing of an application, the application is deemed approved and ready for action by the bureau.
2. Findings. In granting or denying an application, the municipal officers or the county commissioners shall indicate the reasons for their decision and provide a copy to the applicant.
A. Conviction of the applicant of any Class A, Class B or Class c crime: [1987, c45, Pt.A§4 (new).]
B. Noncompliance of the licensed premises or its use with any local zoning ordinance or other land use ordinance not directly related to liquor control; [1987, c.45, Pt.A§4(new).]
C. Conditions of record such as waste disposal violations, health or safety violation or repeated parking or traffic violations on or in the vicinity of the licensed premises and caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises or other such conditions caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises that unreasonably disturb, interfere with or affect the ability of persons or businesses residing or located in the vicinity of the licensed premises to use their property in a reasonable manner; [1993, c.730, §27 (amd).]
D. Repeated incidents of record of breaches of the peace, disorderly conduct, vandalism or other violations of law on or in the vicinity of the licensed premises and caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises; [1989, c.592,§3 (amd).]
E. A violation of any provision of this Title; and [1989, c.592, §3 (amd).]
F. A determination by the municipal officers or county commissioners that the purpose of the application is to circumvent the provisions of section 601. [1989, c.592, §4 (new).]
[1993, c730, §27 (amd).]
3. Appeal to bureau. Any applicant aggrieved by the decision of the municipal officers or county commissioners under this section may appeal to the bureau within 15 days of the receipt of the written decision of the municipal officers or county commissioners.
A. [1993, c.730, §27 (rp).]
4. No license to person who moved to obtain a license. (REPEALED)
5. (TEXT EFFECTIVE 3/15/01) Appeal to District Court. Any person or governmental entity aggrieved by a bureau decision under this section may appeal the decision to the District Court within 30 days of receipt. Upon resolution of the appeal, if an applicant's license renewal is denied, the bureau shall refund the applicant the prorated amount of the unused license fee.
